A PICO question includes the following four elements:

**Population/Persons/Problem:** This highlights the condition or situation that is common and core to the question under consideration.

**Intervention:** The exposure of interest that the person experiences (e.g., therapy, positive test result, presence of a risk factor)

**Co-intervention:** An alternative type of exposure that the person could experience (e.g., no therapy, negative test result, absence of a risk factor—sometimes referred to as the "control")

**Outcomes:** These are the endpoint measures (preferably meaningful to patients or caregivers) that are compared in the evaluation.

Example: For patients with Bell's palsy (P), do oral steroids given within the first three days of onset (I), compared with no steroids (C), improve long-term facial functional outcomes (0)?
